Section 4: First aid measures

4.1 Description of first aid measures

Skin contact: Avoid contact with skin or clothes. Immediately wash with water and soap and rinse thoroughly. If skin irritation continues, consult a doctor.

Eye contact: Immediately wash affected eyes for at least 15 minutes under running water with eyelids held open, consult an eye specialist.

Ingestion: Immediately rinse mouth and then drink plenty of water, do not induce vomiting, seek medical attention.

Inhalation: Remove to fresh air. Get medical attention if irritation persists.

4.2 Most important symptoms and effects, both acute and delayed

Skin contact: Irritating to skin. There may be irritation and redness at the site of contact. Onset symptoms may be delayed.

Eye contact: Can cause severe irritation. There may be irritation and redness. The eyes may water profusely.

Ingestion: There may be soreness and redness of the mouth and throat.

Inhalation: May cause respiratory irritation. May cause allergy or asthma symptoms or breathing difficulty if inhaled. There may be irritation of the throat with a feeling of tightness in the chest. Exposure may cause coughing or wheezing. Onset of symptoms may be delayed.

Immediate/special treatment: eye nothing equipment should be available on the premises.

5.1 Extinguishing media

Extinguishing media: Suitable extinguishing media for surrounding fire should be used. Use water spray to cool containers. Dry chemical powder. Carbon dioxide. Alcohol resistant foam.

Exposure hazards: In combustion emits toxic fumes.

Personal precautions: Wear personal protective equipment. Ensure adequate ventilation. Use breathing apparatus if exposed to vapours/dust/aerosol.

Environmental precautions: Do not discharge into drains or rivers. Contain the spillage using bunding.

6.3 Methods and material for containment and cleaning up

Clean-up procedures: Absorb into dry earth or sand. Transfer to a closable, labelled salvage container for disposal by an appropriate method. Neutralise with water containing 1% wetting agent. To avoid build up of pressure due to the evolution of carbon dioxide, do not seal containers until fully reacted.

7.1 Precautions for safe handling

Handling requirements: Provide suitable exhaust ventilation at the processing machines. Ensure thorough ventilation of stores and work areas. Avoid aerosol formation. When handling heated product, vapours of the product should be ventilated, and respiratory protection used. Wear respiratory protection when spraying. Danger of bursting when sealed gastight. Protect against moisture. Products freshly manufactured from isocyanates can contain incompletely reacted isocyanates and other dangerous substances.

Storage conditions: Avoid contact with water or humidity. Segregate from foods and animal feeds. Segregate from acids. Segregate from oxidants.

8.3 Exposure controls

Engineering measures: Ensure there is sufficient ventilation of the area.

Respiratory protection: If exposure levels are likely to be exceeded, use a full face mask fitted with an organic AXP3 filter for short term low level exposures. For long term or high level exposures, compressed airline breathing apparatus should be used.

Hand protection: Chemical resistant protective gloves (EN 374). Suitable chemical resistant safety gloves (EN374) also with prolonged, direct contact (Recommended: Protective index6, corresponding >480 minutes of permeation time according to EN374); butyl rubber (0.7mm) coating thickness, nitrile rubber (0,4mm), chloroprene rubber (0.5mm).

Unsuitable materials: PVC 0.7mm coating thickness, PE laminate 0.1mm coating thickness.

Eye protection: Safety glassed with side-shields. Ensure eye bath is to hand.

Skin protection: Protective clothing. Wearing of closed work clothing is required additionally to the stated personal protection equipment. When using do not eat, drink or smoke. Hands and/or face should be washed before breaks and at the end of the shift. At the end of the shift the skin should be cleaned and skin-care agents applied.
